



**AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE  
AND THE COLLEGE OF EDUCATION AND HUMAN SERVICES  
CENTRAL MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY**

**STATEMENT OF COOPERATION**

Lansing Community College and Central Michigan University will maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter into this agreement as cooperating educational institutions.

**AGREEMENT ON PRINCIPLE**

Lansing Community College and Central Michigan University agree that any student who successfully completes the course requirements as delineated in this agreement and has followed the appended program guide, may transfer all credits (as specified on appended program guide) toward the Bachelor of Science in Education degree with the Secondary emphasis at Central Michigan University. Total maximum credits will vary based on major and minor selections. The requirements for graduation for students from CMU who follow the attached program guide are expressed as follows:

The remaining academic program requirements, distribution requirements, and other College of Education and Human Services requirements listed in the Central Michigan University catalog.

Completion of a minimum of 60 academic hours from Central Michigan University.

**AGREEMENT OF PROGRAM**


Lansing Community College and Central Michigan University agree that a person who has achieved the minimum grade requirements specified on the program guide may transfer to Central Michigan University without loss of credit. CMU teacher education is a limited enrollment program. Although students of LCC under this agreement may transfer all credits to CMU, they must apply and be admitted to the Teacher Education Program at CMU before becoming eligible to enroll in professional education courses. Students of LCC will receive equal consideration with other students seeking admission. It is further agreed that a person who has completed the requirements of this agreement may graduate from Central Michigan University with a Bachelor of Science in Education degree in Secondary Education without duplicative study by following the program guide appended to this agreement.

## AGREEMENT ON COMMUNICATION


Lansing Community College and Central Michigan University agree to cooperate by communicating with each other and with common and respective publics concerning the established relationships between programs at Lansing Community College and Central Michigan University. Communication will include the development of various kinds of publications to inform people who might benefit personally from the opportunities provided by a bachelor degree program at Central Michigan University based on this agreement with Lansing Community College.

Lansing Community College and Central Michigan University further agree to annually review course equivalencies and to communicate concerning curriculum changes which affect the agreed upon relationship between programs at the respective colleges, and to communicate concerning the development of plans which might lead to future opportunities for cooperation between the two institutions. This cooperation agreement will remain in effect only so long as appropriate department transfer approvals exist. Responsibility for communication related to this agreement will be given to the Dean, Liberal Studies Division and his/her designee, Lansing Community College; and the Dean of the College of Education and Human Services, and the Admissions Office, Central Michigan University.


This agreement shall become effective on the date of signing and shall remain in effect until such time as either party wishes to terminate; notice of termination shall be given in writing at least one year prior to the effective date of termination. Qualified students applying to CMU during or after the semester of the date of signing shall be considered under this agreement.



**ADMISSION TO TEACHER EDUCATION at CMU:** Full details of the Teacher Education Program requirements are available in the current Teacher Education Student Handbook at [www.ehs.cmich.edu/css/](http://www.ehs.cmich.edu/css/).

- Minimum cumulative GPA of 2.70 (B-) or higher calculated at the time of admission.
- Completion of an equivalent to CMU's EDU 107 with a minimum grade of B (3.0).
- Completion of an equivalent to either CMU's ENGLISH 101 or 201 with a minimum grade of B- (2.70).
- Completion of University Competency in both Mathematics and Oral English (Speech) with minimum grades of C (2.0).
- Passing scores on all three sections (Reading; Math; Writing) of the Michigan Basic Skills Test (#96). Recommended prior to transfer and required by the Michigan Department of Education. Registration at [www.mttc.nesinc.com](http://www.mttc.nesinc.com). Fee for this commercial test. Request that scores be sent to CMU.
