

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY**

STATEMENT OF COOPERATION

LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE (LCC) and DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY wish to facilitate the transfer of students who complete an Association in Business degree at LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE, to a baccalaureate degree program in the School of Business at Davenport University. This Agreement is intended to clarify the terms and conditions of transfer for students.

AGREEMENT


LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE and DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY hereby agree as follows:

1. LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE and DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY will maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter into this agreement as equal partners.
2. LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE and DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY agree to provide transfer guides for specific 3+1 programs at the Lansing campus of Davenport University. The transfer guides will furnish detailed LCC course requirements for each 3+1 program.
3. Students will be required to complete a minimum of 30 semester credits for the bachelor's degree to include at least 50% of the courses in the major (including the capstone) must be taken at Davenport University to fulfill the residency policy. Elective courses should be selected with the assistance of the Davenport University advisor.
4. All Davenport University Bachelor of Business Administration (BBA) degrees require a minimum of 120 semester credit hours.
5. Business equivalents are reviewed in accordance with the academic catalogs at LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE and DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY. Any changes, additions, or deletions of business equivalents will be communicated to the appropriate LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE staff and faculty
6. LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE and DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY will continue to cooperate in the development of business and non-business associate degrees articulating into DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY's bachelor degrees.
7. LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE and DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY agree to cooperate by communicating with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established transfer relationship between the two institutions.


- Any marketing of the articulation in print will be subject to the prior approval of both parties. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach their respective student and faculty populations.
 - Faculty and staff at both institutions will communicate information about this agreement to students and prospective students.
 - LCC may provide at its web site, a link to the DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY web site.
8. LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE and DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY agree to communicate curriculum changes that affect the transfer relationship between the colleges.
 9. DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY and LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE agree to exchange transfer student information for the purpose of monitoring and enhancing student academic success. An information exchange will at the minimum, include academic and demographic information required by the Michigan Department of Education, and the Michigan Department of Career Development for educational accountability reports. Additionally, the information will be used to improve and enhance curricular offerings to support student success. At no time will Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) regulations or requirements be violated.
 10. This agreement will become effective upon the execution of signatures by the responsible authority for each institution, and will last for maximum of four (4) years, after which time both institutions will undertake renegotiations of the agreement. If the agreement is not renewed, students who have selected and designated this program prior to termination of the agreement will be given two (2) additional years to be admitted to DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY under the terms of this agreement. Both LCC and DAVENPORT UNIVERSITY agree to provide written notice of at least one full academic year in advance of termination.


