Dear Mr. Farris,

After careful review of the Food Management program offered at Lansing Community College, it appears as if many of the courses offered in your curriculum are parallel to those offered in our Hotel-Restaurant Management/Hospitality Management curriculum.

Therefore, Johnson & Wales University proposes to establish an articulation agreement between our two institutions.

Students who have earned an Associates Degree in the Food Management program at Lansing Community College would be able to transfer their credits toward the completion of a baccalaureate degree in Hospitality Management at Johnson & Wales University. Please note that grades below a "C" will not be accepted in transfer admissions.

For a successful and complete transfer of credits from Lansing CC, it is recommended that students select the following courses at Lansing CC as their elective classes: A literature course, SPH104 or SPH204, College Composition/Writing course, HMF135, HMF229, HMF134, HMF216, HMF206 and HMF231. These elective courses will transfer into the general course requirements, as well as courses needed to complete a baccalaureate degree in Hospitality Management at Johnson & Wales University.

Graduates enrolling in our Hotel-Restaurant Management/Hospitality Management program should, with proper sequencing and scheduling, be able to complete their degree requirements within the equivalent of 2 years of full time study. This will only work effectively if a student has taken course electives recommended as transfer courses by Johnson & Wales University.

The articulation program, if you are in agreement, will become effective March 25, 1991. If your Food Management program does incur curriculum changes it is imperative to inform Johnson & Wales immediately, as this could change the validity of the transfer agreement. Transferring students will be responsible for any curriculum changes while enrolled at the University.

It is expected that Lansing Community College will provide its students presently in its program with all of the information pertaining to this agreement.

We look forward to a fruitful period of cooperation and to serving your students well in the continuation of their education. The following is a list of courses to be accepted in transfer:


