



<p><b>Topic:</b></p>	<p><b>Survey Results from Accounting Programs</b>  A summary of the Fall 2008 student survey was given to the committee. This included student comments. Most students stated they are taking ACCG 210 because it will be useful to them or it is required for their business degree.</p> <p>Suggestions by the committee were that we should obtain CPA pass rates from our alumni. <p><b>Topic:</b></p>	<p><b>Coordination of Curricular Guides</b>  It was decided that ACCG 160, Payroll Systems and Taxes, will be kept as a requirement in both Certificate of Achievement #0714 and Certificate of Completion #1292. There had been previous discussion on moving it to a Limited Choice.</p> <p>We should offer ACCG 160 face-to-face besides just online.</p> <p>We will remove CITA 110 from the Certificate of Completion #1292.</p> <p>We will create a Choice 3 on #0714 with a choice of either ACCG 140 or ACCG 240.</p> <p>It was noted that data mining is taught in upper level courses.</p>
<p><b>Topic:</b></p>	<p><b>Discussion of Future Wants/Needs</b>  Shannon Mulally mentioned that they are starting to teach IFRS (International Financial Reporting Standards) at MSU. IFRS is on the CPA exam. Maybe we should incorporate it into one of our courses. We should get our students trained and exposed. Erik agreed to present this to the faculty during the August kick-off meeting which includes all active teaching faculty. We will discuss more at our Fall meeting.</p> <p>Governmental accounting students compete from various schools.</p>
