Apparel Production
Certificate of Completion

Curriculum Code: 1290 (Effective Fall 2006 – Summer 2011)

The Apparel Production program for fashion related industries focuses on the design elements, development, and production of textile products and related processes and systems. It includes instruction in functional and aesthetic design, commercial sewing, production processes, planning, estimating, and quality assessment. Students may gain hands-on experience in all aspects of the fashion related production process in a supervised fashion internship. Students with this certificate of completion may find entry-level employment in various capacities from textile and apparel related retailing to fashion industry related production jobs; or students may continue their career education by transferring to a four-year institution or by completing course requirements for a certificate of achievement or an associate in applied science degree.
