Associate in Arts in Interdisciplinary Humanities

This degree is designed for students who intend to transfer to a four-year college or university to pursue a baccalaureate degree in this subject area. Students completing this curriculum will also satisfy the [Michigan Transfer Agreement \(MTA\)](#) between two-year and four-year institutions in Michigan and qualify for an LCC [Transfer Studies Certificate of Achievement \(1482\)](#). Transfer students are **strongly** encouraged to apply for this certificate along with their degree, as it clearly announces to four-year colleges and universities that the student has successfully completed the MTA. General education and subject area requirements may vary from one college or university to another. A minimum of 2.0 is required to transfer to other colleges (some colleges, and some programs within colleges, require a higher grade in a course). A. English Composition: One course

B. English Composition (second course) **or Communication:** One course

E. Natural Sciences: A total of 2 courses, each from a different discipline; one must be a lab course

F. Social Science: A total of 2 courses, each from a different discipline
