Wedding Consultant is a program that prepares individuals to become Wedding Planning Consultants. Students will learn to assist families in apparel and fashion selection, style coordination, customer sales and consulting, fabric selection, clothing specifications, and contract buying activities. It includes instruction in supplying regular clothing needs or acting as a consultant for special events such as weddings. Students may find employment in retail bridal salons or they may choose to start their own consulting firm.
