NOTE: All official records, transcripts (college or university), documentation of work experience, completed Selective Admission application, and other required student information regarding dental hygiene admission must be sent to Enrollment Services Office, ATTN: Selective Admissions. Deadline for submission and application is May 1st, yearly. The final determination of points is made by Selective Admissions; therefore, your records must be complete in the Selective Admission Office. Files that are incomplete at the time of selection will not be considered. Attendance of mandatory new student orientation is required of all applicants if admitted to the program. **Students will be notified of admission status to the DH Program by the last week of June.**

Admission to the DH Program requires an approximately \$2,000.00 Instrument Kit Fee, due about July 1st.
