Lansing Community College has been providing solutions to real life and real business challenges for members of the Greater Lansing Area since 1957. Over the years, the college has grown from a small, 400-student technical institution to a comprehensive community college. LCC is big enough to offer Virtual College learning options, provide state-of-the-art computer labs for students, operate one of the best library systems of its kind in the state, and provide thousands of course options. Yet, the college is small enough to give students the attention they need to pave their way to academic and professional success.

LCC is one of the largest single-campus community colleges in the nation. Located on 32 acres covering seven city blocks in Lansing, Michigan, the college offers courses year-round, serves nearly 40,000 students annually and employs more than 2,000 faculty, staff, administrators and student staff. Students may choose from nearly 150 degree and certificate programs (including one-year and less than one-year certificates) and nearly 2,500 different courses to achieve their goals. The college offers career training and transfer opportunities as well as the learning options of televised and interactive television

instruction. LCC is the home of the state's first community college online degree program, LCC Virtual College, which offers students another venue in which to take classes or earn a degree.

The college is a partner in offering the STAR Institute, a unique learning opportunity offering high school juniors and seniors a significant head start on career preparation in high-demand, advanced technology career fields. Another segment of the college is the LCC Foundation which encourages and initiates philanthropic endeavors in support of students and programs. In addition, through its Business & Community Institute, the college provides workforce development and contract training, professional development opportunities and assistance to small businesses through the Small Business Development Center. The Capital Quality Initiative, an organization dedicated to the promotion of quality in the Capitol Area, is also housed in BCI.

LCC's main campus is nestled in the heart of downtown Lansing (near the State Capitol). The college does everything it can to offer employees technological and professional support to assist faculty, staff and administrators in meeting their day-to-day responsibilities. Computer training seminars for all employees are offered regularly as are workshops on enhancing teaching methodology and the learning experience. There are also opportunities for faculty members to teach classes via the Internet through the LCC Virtual College. Training is also available to assist instructors who are unfamiliar with online instruction.

Faculty and Administrative Resources

LCC offers many tools to enhance the teaching experience for faculty and day-to-day work experiences of administrators. Professional development is available both on and off campus. Faculty and administrators are also encouraged to attend conferences and seminars. The college's Center for Teaching Excellence (CTE) is a dynamic resource for faculty. CTE and the Human Resources Development offer a variety of workshops and resources for faculty and administrators. CTE is the place on campus to access resources and ideas about teaching and learning. It offers instructional strategies and support using a collaborative, problem-solving approach to enhance student learning. Equipment from digital cameras and camcorders to laptop computers and portable zip drives can be checked out of CTE by faculty and administrators. The CTE staff is also available to assist faculty in developing student outcomes and designing appropriate assessment methods. Classrooms are equipped with a media retrieval system allowing instructors to access prerecorded videos for students at the touch of a button.
