When possible, your citation should include the following information:

- author
- document title
- website title
- publisher or site sponsor (use N.p. if not available)
- medium of publication (web)
- date of publication or update (use n.d. if not available)
- date of access

Parts of Citation

Name of author, compiler, editor. "Title of page." *Title of overall Web site*. Publisher or site sponsor, Date of publication or last update. Web. Date of access.

TIP: Begin a reference with the title of the document when there is no author or organization.

Name of government. Name of agency. *Publication title*. Name of author. City of publication of print version: Name of publisher of print version, publication date. Web. Date of access.

Parts of Citation

Name of author. "Title of article." *Title of encyclopedia*. Publisher or site sponsor, Date of publication or last update. Web. Date of access.

Newspaper article or newswire

Parts of Citation

Name of author. "Title of article." *Title of newspaper website*. Publisher or site sponsor, Date of publication or last update. Web. Date of access.

LIBRARY RESEARCH DATABASE SOURCES

To cite a source from a library research database, use the format for citing a print source and add the following information about when and where you found the source:

- name of database
- medium of publication (web)
- date of access

If guidelines call for page numbers and there are no page numbers, use n.pag.
