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Hoarding behavior is a challenging phenomenon experienced by a very large and diverse population. It is estimated that over 1.4 million homes in the United States are affected by hoarding behavior though fewer than 10% of all hoarding cases come to the attention of public officials.

The Washtenaw County Hoarding Task Force is a partnership of public and private agencies which seek to raise awareness of hoarding and to preserve safe and appropriate housing by developing best practices and early intervention strategies. They provide hoarding assessments, agency referrals, workshops and professional training.

This workshop will present an overview of hoarding behaviors, best practices, and intervention strategies, including a group therapy approach used with older adults. Participants will learn how community agencies can collaborate to assist adults with hoarding behaviors.
