## **LCC ADMINISTRATOR APPOINTED TO INGHAM COUNTY BOARD OF HEALTH**

LANSING – Nancy M. Hayward, RN, BSN, MPH, LCC Director of Clinical Placement and Outreach for Nursing Programs, has been appointed to a 3-year term on the Ingham County Board of Health. The Board of Health is responsible for identifying public health problems, advising commissioners on health matters, and recommending health services.

“Nancy Hayward is an extraordinary individual,” said Margie Clark, Nursing Careers Department Chair. “She is bright, intelligent, and an inspiration to all with whom we work. She plays a critical role in our current level of excellence, and this appointment assures we will be at the table in addressing public health issues.”

Hayward, a University of Michigan graduate, began her LCC career in 1997 as adjunct faculty teaching in allied health programs: radiology and medical terminology. In 2006, she assumed her current position in which she is responsible for recruitment, training, and mentoring of all LCC clinical faculty. During her tenure, the college’s part time clinical faculty has grown from 32 to 117. As a result of her outreach efforts to the healthcare community, she serves as the voice of LCC on healthcare issues.

“I am truly honored by this appointment,” said Hayward. “This is an opportunity to use my knowledge and experience on even a broader scale and further public health in the region.”

Prior to joining LCC, Hayward served as an acute care nurse at St. Joseph Hospital in Ann Arbor. She also operated her own business providing basic life support and first aid training to major organizations.

The Board of Health advises the Board of Commissioners on issues that relate to public health problems, public health policy, and public health planning. The Board also provides a broad-based focal point of community member and health professional input to the Commissioners,

Human Services Committee, and the Health Department on a full range of health care programs and issues in Ingham County.

The Board of Health participates in state and local organizations, conferences, and seminars to improve their knowledge of public health, as well as shares information from Ingham County.
