# **TWO LCC STUDENT-ATHLETES NAMED NJCAA 2008-09 ALL-AMERICANS** *Men's and women's basketball players honored*

LANSING - Two Lansing Community College student-athletes were recently selected as 2008-09 all-Americans by the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA).

Torrian Harris was named to the NJCAA Division II men's basketball second team all-American squad. Torrian, a 6'-5" sophomore guard from Saginaw, averaged 20.966 points per game (ranked 17th nationally) and 7.33 rebounds per game while leading head coach Mike Ingram's squad to a 22-7 record and consecutive Western Conference Championships in the MCCA.

Jacquelyn Feldpausch was named to the NJCAA Division II women's basketball third team all-American squad. Jackie, a 5'-9" sophomore forward from Grand Ledge, averaged 17.74 points per game (ranked 22<sup>nd</sup> nationally), and 10.22 rebounds per game (ranked 35<sup>th</sup> nationally) for head coach Ervin Brunson's squad. The team finished with a 15-12 record and a berth in the Region XII tournament.

"This is a tremendous distinction for both of these individuals as well as for the college," said LCC Athletic Director Bill Turowski. "It speaks not only to their individual talents, but to the continuing high performance levels of the LCC teams. We couldn't be prouder."

Torrian plans to continue his education and athletic career at the NCAA level and is currently evaluating his options. Jackie will continue her education and basketball at the 4-year college level with Calumet College in Indiana.
