LCC Students Graduate in Nursing, Police, Fire and EMS Ceremonies

LANSING – Ceremonies for students who have completed training at the Fire Science and Police academies, the Emergency Medical Services program and Nursing programs begin this week.

The schedule is:

- Fire Academy - Thursday, May 12 - 28 students will graduate at 5:30 p.m. in Dart Auditorium at the downtown campus.
- Police Academy - Friday, May 13 - 15 students will be honored at 9 a.m. at Dart Auditorium.
- Nursing Pinning Ceremony - Friday, May 13 - 100 nursing students will take part in this time-honored tradition dating back more than a century. Depending on the curricula and length of program the student is pursuing, the pinning programs are held from 12:30 p.m.-2 p.m. or 2:30 p.m.-4 p.m. in Dart Auditorium.
- Emergency Medical Services - Monday, May 16 - 119 students will be honored at 1:30 p.m. in Dart Auditorium.

“LCC has long been at the receiving end of high praise for the caliber of students in all of these programs,” said LCC President Brent Knight. “That’s no accident but rather the result our commitment to excellence in education and training.”

LCC graduates account for the majority of the region’s police and fire personnel as well as community first responders. Three-quarters of all regional allied health professionals received their training at LCC. The Nursing Program has been nationally accredited for more than 40 years and more than 90 percent of LCC nursing students pass the state board exam (NCLEX).

LCC's 53rd Commencement will take place at 7 p.m. Friday, May 20, in the Jack Breslin Student Events Center at Michigan State University.
