Requirements:

- ❖ Currently enrolled in a nursing program (ADN, BSN or MSN) in the state of Michigan.
- ❖ Resident of the state of Michigan.
- ❖ Can be full-time or part-time student.
- ❖ Signed statement of intent.
- ❖ GPA of 3.0 or higher (attach transcript - unofficial).
- ❖ Participation in community service activities- list of activities not to exceed one typed page.
- ❖ Answer the two essay questions included on the application – response not to exceed one typed page.
- ❖ Complete and return the following application.
- ❖ Two letters of reference required- one must be from a health care professional (i.e. professor, manager).
- ❖ Please send all material in one envelope.

Education and Training Voucher (ETV): Offer up to \$4,000 towards school-related costs and living fees. It is for youth that were in foster care after the age of 14. Contact Lutheran Social Services of Michigan for eligibility requirements at (887)-660-METV or go to the website at <http://mietv.lssm.org/>

You must receive your first ETV prior to your 21st birthday. You are then eligible until your 23rd birthday, provided you receive at least a 2.0 GPA and do not drop more than one class per semester.

Requirements:

- ❖ Were in foster care on or after your 14th birthday because of abuse/neglect
- ❖ Were adopted from foster care on or after your 16th birthday
- ❖ Must have a high school diploma or GED
- ❖ Attend at least half-time, an accredited school that:
 - Awards a Bachelor's degree or no less than a 2-year program that provides credit towards a degree,
 - Provides no less than 1-year of training towards gainful employment, or
 - Is a vocational program that provides training for gainful employment and has been in existence for at least two years.
