SELECTIVE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

Students meeting basic admission requirements will be ranked for admittance into the program using a point value system. Those with the highest number of points will be selected for admission. Points will only be awarded to students who meet the basic admission requirements at the time of selection.

Selective Admission Applications must be submitted to Student Finance at the payment counter in the Star Zone on the 2nd floor of the Gannon Building. There is a \$50 non-refundable application fee due at the time of submission. Students should attach all required documentation of work experience and other required student information regarding the Radiologic Technology Program. Applications can be mailed with a \$50 check to 7120-Student Finance, Lansing Community College, PO Box 40010, Lansing MI 48901-7210.

PHASE I - ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- 1. Complete all LCC requirements for general admission to the college lcc.edu/apply.
- Submit completed selective admission application and \$50.00 fee to the payment counter in the Star Zone on the 2nd floor of the Gannon Building, by (May 1, 2019) for (Fall 2019) selection. Applications can be held on file for 1 year only at student's request; after that time a new application must be submitted.
- All transcripts from other colleges and universities must be received by LCC's Enrollment Services by May 10, 2019 in order to be considered for Fall 2019 admission.
- 4. Evidence of good physical and mental health.
- 5. Applicants must complete all courses required for admission with a minimum grade of 2.0.
- 6. Applicants transferring mathematics from another college must have equivalent credit to Lansing Community College's MATH 119 Applications for Living or higher or STAT 170 or higher with a 2.0 or better. Applicants with an associate's degree or higher will have LCC Core Education requirements waived, but must show proficiency in MATH 121 or higher and BIOL 201 and 202.
