Curriculum Code: 1706 (Effective Fall 2015 – Summer 2016)

The EMS Management Certification Certificate of Completion Program is intended for EMS personnel interested in becoming entry level managers. It is a one-course certificate program that covers billing, computer-aided dispatch/system status management, legal and labor relations, EMS special operations, Homeland Security critical infrastructure protection, operation, site security and terrorism incident response, and EMS response to weapons of mass destruction. This course meets FEMA requirements for Emergency Preparedness Response Management.
