Curriculum Code: 1200 (Effective Fall 2016 – Summer 2021)

The Aging Studies curriculum focuses on knowledge of physical, mental, and social aspects of aging. Students are introduced to the aging process, social institutions and policies, programs and services, and providing direct services to older persons and their families. This is the first certificate in an enhanced human services career pathway. Core principles from the Association for Gerontology in Higher Education serve as a guideline for course work.

Students who anticipate continuing their education into the Human Services Certificate of Achievement and applying for practicum placement must meet with the Human Services Program Director prior to or during their first semester to complete an educational plan, and obtain course and practicum information.
2. GERO, HUSE, and SOWK courses must be completed with a minimum 2.5 grade or higher to be counted toward this Certificate of Completion as well as for practicum placement. Any courses other than GERO, HUSE, and SOWK must be completed with a minimum 2.0 to be counted toward this Certificate of Completion.
3. Students must seek Human Services Program Director approval for other course options based on their career goals.
