This degree provides concentrated study in art at the pre-professional level. It is structured to facilitate students' transfer to a four-year university with a professional degree program: the Bachelor of Fine Arts degree, usually a double major in a specific art concentration. Graduates will be well versed to enter any baccalaureate major with an art concentration. Additional education will enhance an individual's employment and advancement opportunities. Not all courses in this degree transfer to all colleges. Students planning to transfer should see an academic advisor before enrolling in any course.
