Human Services A.A.S. Pathway

This degree is designed for students who intend to transfer to a four-year college or university to pursue a baccalaureate degree in this subject area. Students completing this curriculum will also satisfy the Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) between two-year and four-year institutions in Michigan and qualify for an LCC Transfer Studies Certificate of Achievement (1482).

General Education - MTA: MINIMUM: 30 credits

Complete General Education - MTA Requirements for the Associate of Arts Degree

- A. English Composition: One course
- B. English Composition (second course) or Communication: One course
- C. Humanities and Fine Arts: A total of 2 courses, each from a different discipline
- D. Mathematics: One course from Quantitative Reasoning, College Algebra or Statistics
- E. Natural Sciences: A total of 2 courses, each from a different discipline; one must be a lab course
- F. Social Science: A total of 2 courses, each from a different discipline

The trained Human Services employee assists professional staff in social service and human services agencies. The associate degree is generalist in nature, with all students acquiring an education in addictions, aging, and family. This degree is part of an enhanced career pathway into the profession. The education provides the opportunity to learn the history of human services, the necessity for a Code of Ethics, structure of community agencies, the programs and services provided, and the populations served. Standards from the Council for Standards in Human Services Education, the generic competencies and the ethical standards from the National Organization for Human Services serve as guidelines for the course work. Select general education courses compliment this degree.

For students interested in addiction, contact Michigan Certification Board for Addiction Professionals at www.mcbap.com for current addiction credentialing. Students interested in aging should follow the Human Services Aging Studies course work.

Students must meet the criteria as described in the Human Services Advising Guide for a supervised consecutive two-semester practicum within a community agency for experiential learning. Students are required to meet with the Human Services Program Director (Room 108 HHS Building) prior to or during their first semester to obtain practicum information and application requirements for fall semester. Before practicum placement a criminal background check is required, and a DHHS Central Registry check is required for placement with children/families and/or agencies providing services to children/families.

To graduate with this degree a 2.5 grade or higher is required in all GERO, HUSE, SOWK courses and Specialization Choices. General education courses require a 2.0 grade or higher. An overall 2.5 GPA or higher is required. Students are encouraged to take the required general education courses in their first, second, third and summer semesters to complete the degree on time.

- C. Children and Families: Students must complete HUSE 110 plus one additional Human Services Program Director approved course of 3-4 credits.
