Students continuing their education for the Human Services Certificate of Achievement or Human Services Associate Degree are required to meet with the Human Services Program Director prior to or during their first semester of this certificate to obtain practicum information and application requirements for fall semester. Before practicum placement at the next level a criminal background check is required, and a DHHS Central Registry check is required for placement with children/families and/or agencies providing services to children/families.

To earn this Certificate of Completion a 2.5 grade or higher is required in all GERO, HUSE, SOWK courses and Specialization Choices. Students continuing their education are encouraged to take the required general education courses in their first, second, third and summer semesters to complete the Human Services Associate Degree on time.
