This certificate of completion provides the student with a broad-based introduction to the Information Technology (IT) field. Students also learn skills for basic computer repair and support, allowing them to earn the industry respected CompTIA A+ certification. This certificate is especially suited to help an undecided student select which aspect of IT to pursue, or to allow a person with a non-IT background and/or degree to add basic IT skills, or as a starting point for students seeking the Computer Networking and Cybersecurity, Associate in Business degree (1453).
