



## **Community Paramedicine C.C.**

Career Community: Health Careers

### **Purpose of the Major**

Community Paramedicine is an emerging profession aimed at improving the quality and access to healthcare services for underserved patients of varying cultural, religious, social, and economic backgrounds. Community Paramedicine utilizes licensed Paramedics in an expanded scope of practice to serve a wide variety of community healthcare needs. Community Paramedics are typically employed through emergency medical service agencies or hospital systems. This two-semester program prepares a licensed Paramedic for an expanded scope of practice and role as a community healthcare provider. Upon successful completion of this program, students will be eligible to take the International Board of Specialty Certification (IBSC) exam.

Courses in this program are offered through the Michigan Workforce Training and Education Collaborative, and are taught by various colleges in the Michigan Educational Programs in Collaboration (MI-EPiC) Consortium.

### **Milestone**

Completion of CPAR 250, CPAR 251, and CPAR 252 with a 3.0 or higher is a key component for success in completing this program. Knowledge obtained in these courses is the foundation for learning in other required courses. Students are encouraged to contact their faculty if they need additional assistance with learning the concepts presented in these courses.

### **Additional Information**

The Community Paramedicine Consortium Program through the Michigan Workforce Training and Education Collaborative of which LCC is a member, has been developed to be consistent with the standards and requirements of the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, Bureau of EMS, Trauma and Preparedness (MDHHS-BETP).

The Community Paramedicine program is intended for licensed Paramedics interested in serving their communities in an expanded role as a Community Paramedic. To progress through the program and be eligible to receive the Community Paramedicine Certificate of Completion, all courses in this curriculum must be completed with a 3.0 grade or better.
