

**ARTICULATION AGREEMENT  
BETWEEN LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE  
AND CENTRAL MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY**

**STATEMENT OF COOPERATION**

Lansing Community College (LCC) and Central Michigan University (CMU) wish to facilitate the transfer of students who complete an associate's degree at LCC to a bachelor's degree program at CMU. This Agreement is intended to clarify the terms and conditions of transfer for students.

**AGREEMENT**

Lansing Community College and Central Michigan University hereby agree as follows:

1. A person who has earned an **Associate in Applied Science - Fire Technology - Fire Fighter, Associate in Applied Science - Fire Technology- Fire Service Management, Associate in Applied Science - Fire Science - Basic EMT or the Associate in Applied Science Criminal Justice - Law Enforcement with Mid-Michigan Police Academy degree** from LCC and achieved the minimum grade requirements specified by CMU (C or higher 2.0 for competency courses and those specified courses outlined on the accompanying guide sheet that are submitted for Prior Learning assessment and a C- or higher 1.7 all others) may transfer all credits earned at LCC as listed on the Articulation Guide to CMU.
  
2. A person who has earned an **Associate in Applied Science - Fire Technology- Fire Fighter, Associate in Applied Science - Fire Technology - Fire Service Management, Associate in Applied Science - Fire Science - Basic EMT or the Associate in Applied Science Criminal Justice – Law Enforcement with Mid-Michigan Police Academy degree** from LCC and has followed the attached Articulation Guide may transfer all credits specified on the Articulation Guide towards the **Bachelor of Science degree with an Option in Community Development with a Public Administration concentration** at CMU without duplicative study. To complete requirements for graduation from CMU, students who follow the attached Articulation Guide must also:
  - a) Complete a minimum of 30 academic hours at CMU.
  - b) Complete a minimum of 124 academic hours between LCC and CMU.
  - c) Complete the remaining program requirements, distribution requirements and other major and degree requirements listed in the CMU Global Campus bulletin.
  - d) Receive successful evaluation and award of the Prior Learning Portfolio requirement as written below (section3). A grade of C, 2.0 or higher is required in order for courses to be presented for Prior Learning for this program. Detailed information regarding Prior Learning may be found at:

3. As written in the Articulation Guide, in order for Lansing Community College students to receive UNY 297 credit for those courses that don't receive direct transfer credit they must complete and submit tab Y of the Prior Learning Portfolio for each course designated on the Articulation Guide as potentially receiving Prior Learning credit (UNY 297). Upon receipt of the Prior Learning award the student will be required to pay a \$35.00 (Thirty-five dollars) fee per credit hour. Students are only obligated to pay for those credits that are applied toward meeting degree requirements. In order for the Prior Learning awarded credit to be applied toward the degree and appear on the transcript the credits must be paid in full within one year of the date awarded. The awarded credit is considered equivalent to baccalaureate level transfer credit.
4. LCC and CMU agree to cooperate by communicating with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning this established relationship.
5. To the extent permitted by the Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), LCC and CMU agree to share data on student achievement for purposes of assessing program effectiveness.
6. LCC and CMU agree to communicate annually any curriculum changes or policies which affect the agreed-upon relationship. Both parties reserve the right to amend or revise this agreement. These changes must be submitted in writing.
7. LCC and CMU further agree to communicate concerning the development of plans that might lead to future opportunities for cooperation between the two institutions. Responsibility for communication related to the agreement will be given to the Director of Undergraduate Programs and Academic Liaison and his/her designee, Global Campus, CMU and the Post-Secondary Articulation Coordinator, Office of Academic Affairs at Lansing Community College.
8. To the extent permitted by applicable law, LCC and CMU each agree to defend, indemnify and hold harmless the other party and its trustees, officers, directors, employees, and/or agents from and against liability, loss, cost and/or expense, including reasonable attorneys' fees, and/or from and against claims for injury and/or damages by third parties arising out of this Agreement, but only in proportion to and to the extent such liability, loss, cost and/or expense, and/or claims for injury and/or damages are caused by or result from the negligent acts or omissions or intentional acts or omissions of the indemnifying party, its trustees, officers, directors, employees, and/or agents.
9. This agreement constitutes the entire agreement between LCC and CMU and supersedes any previous Associate in Applied Science - Fire Technology - Fire Fighter, Associate in Applied Science - Technology - Fire Service Management, Associate in Applied Science - Fire Science - Basic EMT or the Associate in Applied Science Criminal Justice - Law Enforcement with Mid-Michigan Police Academy degree Articulation Agreements.

10. This agreement terminates July 1<sup>st</sup>, 2018; however, either party may terminate this agreement upon 90 days' written notice to the other party.
11. All notices and other communications under this Agreement must be in writing and will be deemed given (a) when delivered personally, (b) on the fourth business day after being mailed by certified mail, return receipt requested, or (c) the next business day after delivery to a recognized overnight courier at the following addresses (or to such other address as either party may have specified by notice given to the other party pursuant to this provision):

Criminal Justice – Law Enforcement with Police Academy.</b></p> <p>Because law enforcement employment must be obtained within 1 year of successful completion of the MCOLES this agreement provides students with three options:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. If a student desires to complete the Law Enforcement Program prior to pursuing their bachelor degree they may enroll in the B.S.C.D. program at a later date.</li> <li>2. If a student desires to complete their bachelor degree prior to a career in law enforcement they may do so by completing all of the necessary courses and then enroll in the Police Academy at Lansing Community College. Once this has been successfully completed the student will need to complete and submit their Prior Learning Portfolio in addition to their transcript to CMU.</li> <li>3.
