The remaining required and elective courses for the bachelor's degree will be selected in consultation with an academic advisor to ensure that CMU major, minor, prerequisite, other degree and graduation requirements are being met. The bachelor's degree requires a minimum of 120 semester hours of credit. A minimum of 60 credits must be from a four-year institution. A minimum of 40 semester hours of credit at the 300 level or higher is required. A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned from CMU.
