

## Addendum Surgical Technologist – LCC Transfer Information

See official articulation agreement amendment for approved list of Mid Michigan Community College courses that may transfer and apply onto Lansing Community College's Surgical Technology Program. That articulation agreement and advising guide are both available from website.

- **Additional Pre-Requisite Courses to be taken through LCC: CHSE 120 (4) Medical Terminology; SURG 103 (2) Surgical Asepsis** (Both of these courses are available online from LCC.)
- Grade requirements for transfer into Lansing Community College's (LCC's) Surgical Tech. Program: 2.0 or better in MAT 105, SPE 101, & ENG 111; 2.5 in other courses.
- BIO 141 and BIO 142 should be current (taken within 5 years of entering the program).
- LCC's Coordinator of Surgical Technology must sign-off on substitution of SPCH 120 (SPE 101) to fulfill the SPCH 110 program requirement and one of the following courses to fulfill the SPCH 280 program requirement: HIS 101, HIS 102, POL 250, SOC 101, or SPE 195. This will be done upon review prior to graduation.
- The Surgical Technology Program is a selective admission program with a limited number of openings each year. Upon satisfactory completion of all prerequisites, students will apply to LCC's Surgical Technology Program. Admission procedures are coordinated through LCC Enrollment Services Office. They are responsible for distributing, receiving and dating application forms. Therefore, any student desiring admission into this program should contact Enrollment Services, GVT Building-Suite 2200 (517) 483-1200, e-mail [selectiveadmission@lcc.edu](mailto:selectiveadmission@lcc.edu) to receive an application. The student may then contact the program advisor, Joseph Long, for further information by calling (517) 483-1432 or (517) 483-1410 or e-mailing [longj9@lcc.edu](mailto:longj9@lcc.edu).
- Application to LCC due by May 1<sup>st</sup>, selection by mid June, orientation held end of July, with classes beginning end of August.
- Clinical facilities mandate that the Hepatitis B vaccine series be **completed** prior to surgery observation, which occurs the first two weeks in December. The vaccine is a series of three (3) injections (approximately \$40.00-\$100.00 per injection) given over a 7 month period. **Applicants are required to submit proof of the first injection by the May 1, 2014, application deadline.** Proof must be submitted to the Enrollment Services Office.
- LCC's Surgical Tech program expects to accept a minimum of 3 MMCC students each year.

In accordance with the Agreement, LCC and MMCC have completed a programmatic review and have agreed to the changes listed below.




1. Courses satisfy the LCC General Education Core *Global Perspectives and Diversity* requirements.
