



**Articulation Agreement
Between
Lansing Community College
and
Davenport University**

**ARTICLE I
STATEMENT OF COOPERATION**

Lansing Community College (LCC) and Davenport University agree that students who choose to begin their studies at LCC and transfer to Davenport University to earn a bachelor's degree should be provided with a smooth curriculum transition that minimizes loss of credit and duplication of coursework. Therefore, LCC and Davenport University agree to enter into this Articulation Agreement (Agreement) as cooperating educational institutions and will maintain the integrity of their separate programs.

**ARTICLE II
AGREEMENT ON PROGRAM SPECIFICS**

LCC and Davenport University agree that any student who has earned an associate degree from LCC may transfer credits up to a maximum of 60 (or more as determined by specific program agreements) credit hours toward a corresponding baccalaureate degree at Davenport University. The following stipulations apply:

Students with an awarded associate degree from LCC may transfer a maximum of 60 (or more as determined by specific program agreements) transferable semester credits to a corresponding bachelor's degree at Davenport University.

1. Students will be required to earn a total of at least 120 semester credits, including those transferred from LCC.
2. All grades of 2.0 or higher in an awarded associate degree will transfer, unless a higher grade point is required by specific program agreements.

3. Program Specific Details will be identified on Transfer Guides developed for specific degree programs.
4. LCC students must comply with Davenport University's Transfer Admission Process and Standards.

ARTICLE III AGREEMENT ON COMMUNICATION

LCC and Davenport University agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective audiences concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. LCC and Davenport University further agree to communicate concerning curriculum changes which affect the agreed upon relationship between articulated programs at the respective institutions and to communicate concerning the development of plans which might lead to future opportunities between the two institutions.

1. Any marketing of the Agreement in print will be subject to the prior approval of both parties. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach their respective student and faculty populations.
2. Faculty and staff at both institutions will communicate information about this Agreement to current and prospective students.
3. Each party may provide on its website, a link to the partner institution's website.
4. LCC and Davenport University agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between the two institutions. Communication may include the development of various kinds of publications to inform those who might benefit personally or professionally from the opportunities provided by this agreement. Faculty and staff at both institutions will share the information in this agreement with interested and qualified students and both institutions will provide counseling and advising to current and prospective students.

Review and Modification of the Agreement - Each institution will notify the other of any contemplated curricular changes that would affect the future of this Agreement.

ARTICLE V

INDEMNIFICATION

Indemnification - To the fullest extent permitted under Michigan law, LCC and Davenport University agree to indemnify and hold one another harmless from any and all claims initiated by student participants, their parents, survivors, or agents, arising from any negligent acts or omission on the part of either institution or any of their employees, officers, and trustees.

ARTICLE VI

REVERSE TRANSFER

Reverse Transfer - In the event that a student strives to transfer at an earlier stage in the degree completion lifecycle, Davenport University will notify LCC of and provide the appropriate information to facilitate transferring credits back to our institution for the awarding of an associate degree.

Lansing Community College and Davenport University agree to the terms of this Agreement.
