

*An Articulation Agreement
between
Bennett College
and
Lansing Community College*

STATEMENT OF COOPERATION

In the interest of increasing and focusing our efforts to build bridges of understanding and cooperation between our two Institutions so that we further encourage African-American youths to complete high school and pursue advanced degrees, and

In the interest of working together to build a strong program that will be unique in nature and respectful of the role and mission of each of our institutions.

Lansing Community College (LCC) and Bennett College agree to enter into a relationship which facilitates the transfer of students, enhance the number and quality of learning options, and provide a seamless transfer process for students at Lansing Community College who desire further education at Bennett College. Bennett College is accredited by the Commission on Colleges of the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools (SACS), and is located in Greensboro, North Carolina. AGREEMENT

Lansing Community College and Bennett College hereby agree as follows:

1. *Lansing Community College and Bennett College will maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter into this agreement as equal partners.*
2. ***Admission and Academic Requirements***
 - *A minimum 2.0 grade point average and good standing is required for admission.*
 - *No courses with a grade below "C" (2.0) will transfer.*
 - *A minimum of 58 semester hours is required for junior status*
 - *Bennett College General Education Requirements and LCC equivalents are attached to this agreement.*
3. ***Advising of LCC Students*** – *Advising of LCC students regarding admission and program requirements to Bennett College will be the responsibility of the regular advising staff at LCC. Bennett College will designate one or more points of contact to respond to advising questions from LCC advisors. Each institution will monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under this agreement, and identify problems that may interfere with the successful transfer of student to Bennett College.*
4. ***Communication*** – *Lansing Community College and Bennett College agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between the two institutions.*

- Any marketing of the articulation in print will be subject to the prior approval of both parties. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach their respective student and faculty populations.
 - Faculty and staff at both institutions will communicate information about this agreement to students and prospective students.
 - LCC may provide at its website, a link to the Bennett College website.
5. **Length of Agreement** – This agreement will become effective upon the execution of signatures by the responsible authority for each institution, and will last for a maximum of four years, after which time both institutions will undertake renegotiations of the agreement. If the agreement is not renewed, students who have selected and designated this program prior to termination of the agreement, will be given two additional years to be admitted to Bennett College under the terms of this agreement. Both LCC and Bennett College agree to provide written notice of at least one full academic year in advance of termination.
6. **Review and Modification of the Agreement** – Each institution will notify the other of any contemplated curricular changes that would affect the future of this agreement.
