ARTICULATION AGREEMENT

BETWEEN LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE

AND

TENNESSEE STATE UNIVERSITY

STATEMENT OF COOPERATION

Lansing Community College (LCC) and Tennessee State University wish to facilitate the transfer of students, enhance the number and quality of learning options, and provide a seamless transfer process for students at Lansing Community College who desire further education at Tennessee State University. Tennessee State University is accredited by the Southern Association of Colleges and Schools, Commission on Colleges, and is located at 3500 John A. Merritt Blvd., Nashville, TN 37209-1561, telephone 615-251-1111. An overview of the university, plus academic information is available at http://www.tnstate.edu.

AGREEMENT

Lansing Community College and Tennessee State University hereby agree as follows:

- 1. Lansing Community College and Tennessee State University will maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter into this agreement as equal partners.
- 2. Advising of LCC Students Advising of LCC students regarding admission and program requirements to Tennessee State University will be the responsibility of the regular advising staff at LCC. Tennessee State University will designate one or more points of contact to respond to advising questions from LCC advisors. Each institution will monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under this agreement, and identify problems that may interfere with the successful transfer of students to Tennessee State University.
- 3. **Communication** Lansing Community College and Tennessee State University agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between the two institutions.
 - Any marketing of the articulation in print will be subject to the prior approval of both parties. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach their respective student and faculty populations.
 - Faculty and staff at both institutions will communicate information about this agreement to students and prospective students.
 - LCC may provide at its website, a link to the Tennessee State University website.
- 4. **Equivalent LCC Courses** Recommended LCC courses are provided for the TSU General Education requirements (see Appendix A).
- 5. Length of Agreement This agreement will become effective upon the execution of signatures by the responsible authority for each institution, and will last for a maximum of three (3) years, after which time both institutions will undertake renegotiations of the agreement. If the agreement is not renewed, students who have selected and designated this program prior to termination of the agreement, will be given two (2) additional years to be admitted to Tennessee State University under the terms of this agreement. Both LCC and Tennessee State University agree to provide written notice of at least one full academic year in advance of termination.
- 6. **Review and Modification of the Agreement** Each institution will notify the other of any contemplated curricular changes that would affect the future of this agreement.

- 7. **Indemnification -** To the extent permitted by law, Tennessee State University and Lansing Community College agree to indemnify and hold one another harmless from any and all claims initiated by student participants, their parents, survivors, agents, or third party beneficiary rights, arising from any negligent acts or willful misconduct on the part of either institution or any of their employees.
- 8. **Exchange of Information** The Tennessee State University and Lansing Community College agree to exchange transfer student information for the purpose of monitoring and enhancing student academic success. The information may also be used to enhance curricular offerings. At no time will Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) regulations or requirements be violated.
