# INSTITUTIONAL ARTICULATION AGREEMENT between LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE and OLIVET COLLEGE

## ARTICLE I STATEMENT OF COOPERATION

Lansing Community College ("LCC") and Olivet College ("Olivet") agree that students who choose to begin their Insurance and Risk Management studies at LCC and transfer to Olivet to earn a bachelor's degree in Insurance and Risk Management should be provided with a smooth curriculum transition that minimizes loss of credit and duplication of coursework. Therefore, LCC and Olivet agree to enterinto this Articulation Agreement ("Agreement") as cooperating educational institutions and will maintain the integrity of their separate programs.

Through this agreement, the colleges will endeavor to:

- Collaborate, via faculty, administrators, and staff at both colleges toward the goal of facilitating the implementation of this articulation agreement;
- Develop joint materials to market and define program pathways leading to the obtainment of a Bachelor of Arts degree in Insurance and Risk Management through Olivet College;
- Promote student academic preparation and transfer planning at Lansing Community College and assist students in their transfer to Olivet College; and
- Support and promote the value and benefit of the combination of a Lansing Community College-Olivet College experience leading to an Associate of Business degree via the Insurance and Risk Management A.B. Pathway at Lansing Community College and obtainment of a Bachelor of Arts degree in Insurance and Risk Management at Olivet College.

This articulation agreement does not any affect other agreements between Lansing Community College and Olivet College.

# ARTICLE II AGREEMENT ON PROGRAM SPECIFICS

LCC and Olivet agree to the following:

- Any student who has earned an Associate Degree in Business (A.B.) from LCC having completed the Insurance and Risk Management A.B. Pathway may transfer credits up to a maximum of 62 semester hours toward the Bachelor of Arts degree (B.A.) at Olivet.
- 2. Students must meet all standard admission requirements of Olivet College in place at the time of matriculation at Olivet.

- 3. Courses completed as part of the LCC Associate Degree in Business (A.B.) Insurance and Risk Management A.B. Pathway will be accepted in transfer by Olivet and applied to a Bachelor of Arts degree (B.A.) in Insurance and Risk Management as outlined in Appendix A.
- 4. Courses and requirements to be completed at Olivet by transfer students holding the Associate Degree in Business (A.B.) from LCC having completed the Insurance and Risk Management A.B. Pathway are outlined in Appendix B.
- 5. Only courses graded a "C" (2.0) or better will transfer to Olivet.
- 6. Students who have completed Michigan Transfer Agreement (MTA) requirements at LCC are eligible to waive the following Liberal Arts Core (LAC) Curriculum graduation requirements at Olivet:
  - IDS 111/112 Writing & Rhetoric I/II
  - IDS 151 Self & Community
  - IDS 211 Civilization Studies
  - Mathematics Proficiency Course
  - Natural World Course
  - Creative Experience Course
  - Global Diversity Courses

Students who enrolled in college prior to fall 2014 may use the MACRAO agreement and have until August 2019 to have MACRAO requirements evaluated by the community college. If already on the transcript, the MACRAO designation will be accepted at Olivet. Students who have not satisfied the MTA or MACRAO agreement must complete Olivet's Liberal Arts Core Curriculum requirements as described in the academic catalog for the academic year in which they matriculate at Olivet.

- 7. All Olivet graduation and program requirements as described in the academic catalog must be satisfied whether by transferred courses, Olivet courses, or approved substitutions or waivers.
- 8. Advising of LCC students regarding admission and program requirements at Olivet will be the responsibility of LCC.
- Each institution will monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under this
  Agreement and identify problems that may interfere with the successful transfer of students to
  Olivet.
- 10. Under this Agreement, graduates of LCC will receive equal consideration with other students seeking admission to the Insurance and Risk management program at Olivet. When program growth results in space limitations, provisions will be made to reserve space for LCC students planning entry into this program.

### ARTICLE III COMMUNICATION AND MARKETING

- 1. LCC and Olivet agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective audiences concerning the established relationship between the two institutions.
- 2. LCC and Olivet agree to communicate concerning curriculum changes which affect the agreed upon relationship between articulated programs at the respective college, and to communicate concerning the development of plans which might lead to future opportunities between the two institutions.
- 3. Any marketing of the Agreement in print will be subject to the prior approval of both parties. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach their respective student and faculty populations.
- 4. Faculty and staff at both institutions will communicate information about this Agreement to students and prospective students.
- 5. LCC agrees to share with Olivet directory information, including email addresses, for students enrolled in the Insurance and Risk Management A.B. Pathway for purposes of advising and promotion.
- 6. Each party may provide on its website a link to the partner institution's website.
- 7. Olivet will provide transfer student performance data to LCC officials annually upon request.

# ARTICLE IV MAINTENANCE AND REVIEW OF AGREEMENT

1. The designated representatives of each party are listed below. All business documents, notices, questions, problems, administrative matters, and communication regarding this articulation agreement shall be directed to:

- 2. Responsibility for oversight of this Agreement with the respective program directors and deans will be continuous. Each institution retains control over its curriculum, course requirements, program requirements, and degree requirements.
- 3. Each college will notify the other of any curricular changes that would affect the courses associated with this Agreement or that could affect the future of this Agreement.
- 4. An annual review of this Agreement will be completed by June 1 of each calendar year by each institution. This will allow both colleges to meet annual catalog deadlines and update college websites accordingly. Both colleges agree to communicate within ten (10) business days any changes in their respective programs that affect this Agreement.

## ARTICLE V INDEMNIFICATION

To the extent permitted by Michigan law, LCC and Olivet agree to indemnify and hold one another harmless from any and all claims initiated by student participants, their parents, survivors, or agents, arising from any negligent acts oromission on the part of either institution or any of their employees.

#### ARTICLE VI ENTIRE AGREEMENT

This agreement is specific to the academic pathway to a Bachelor of Arts in Insurance and Risk Management degree from Olivet following a student's completion of an Associate in Business degree via the Insurance and Risk Management A.B. Pathway at LCC.

# ARTICLE VII ADDENDUMS, MODIFICATIONS, OR TERMINATION

No amendment or modifications to this Agreement, including any modification or amendment of this paragraph, shall be effective unless the same is in writing and signed by all parties or their successors. This Agreement will be effective immediately upon authorized signature by each college's designee and shall remain in effect for ten (10) years.

Either party may terminate this Agreement at any time with no less than ninety (90) days' written notice. In the event that this Agreement is terminated, students enrolled in LCC will be given the opportunity to matriculate to Olivet under the terms of this Agreement within four years following first enrollment at LCC.
