

ARTICULATION AGREEMENT
BETWEEN LANSING COMMUNITY COLLEGE
AND
WESTERN MICHIGAN UNIVERSITY

STATEMENT OF COOPERATION

Lansing Community College (LCC) and Western Michigan University (WMU) wish to facilitate the transfer of LCC students to the Western Michigan University Bachelor of Science in Elementary Education program. Western Michigan University is accredited by the Higher Learning Commissions, a subcommittee of the North Central Association of Colleges and Schools and its education program is accredited by the National Council for Accreditation of Teacher Education. AGREEMENT


Lansing Community College and Western Michigan University hereby agree as follows:

1. Lansing Community College and Western Michigan University will maintain the integrity of their separate programs and enter into this agreement as equal partners.
2. Specific details of the articulated program are included in the attached document (Attachment "A").
3. **Advising of LCC Students** – Advising of LCC students regarding admission and program requirements to Western Michigan University will be the responsibility of the regular advising staff at LCC. The College of Education Advising Office is designated the WMU point of contact. Each institution will monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under this agreement, and identify problems that may interfere with the successful transfer of student to Western Michigan University.
4. **Communication** – Lansing Community College and Western Michigan University agree to cooperate in communicating with each other and with their common and respective publics concerning the established relationship between the two institutions.
 - Any marketing of the articulation in print will be subject to the prior approval of both parties. Each institution will assume responsibility for appropriate marketing to reach their respective student and faculty populations.
 - Faculty and staff at both institutions will communicate information about this agreement to students and prospective students.
 - LCC may provide at its website, a link to the Western Michigan University website.
5. **Length of Agreement** – This agreement will become effective upon the execution of signatures by the responsible authority for each institution, and shall remain in effect until such time as either party wishes to terminate. The agreement shall be honored for two academic years immediately following the notification to terminate so students currently under the agreement may finish their plan of study.
6. **Review and Modification of the Agreement** – Each institution will notify the other of any contemplated curricular changes that would affect the future of this agreement.
7. **Exchange of Information** – Western Michigan University and Lansing Community College agree to exchange transfer student information for the purpose of monitoring and enhancing student


academic success. The information may also be used to enhance curricular offerings. At no time will Family Education Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) regulations or requirements be violated.





Lansing Community College students should complete the courses listed on the left below, plus the choice of two additional minors. Completion of the courses will satisfy requirements for the Associate of Arts degree in Liberal Arts at LCC with MACRAO endorsement. Courses remaining to be done at WMU appear on the right.

For admission to the Professional Elementary Education Program at WMU, students completing the LCC courses below must meet the following requirements:

- Earn a cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.5 or better
- Earn passing scores on the Michigan Test for Teacher Certification (MTTC) - Basic Skills section
