The accelerated MSA program will allow an Organizational Leadership major to reduce the total number of credits to complete their graduate degree by 12 semester hours. Admission criteria for the Accelerated MSA program can be located in the MSA section of the bulletin. See your academic advisor for details.</p> <p>Minor in any university approved minor or internship (20-30 hours): Internship must be 20-30 hours and sponsored by the department of the major. Administration and registration may be through related disciplines but the responsibility of the internship requirements, parameters, etc., must be that of the department of the major.</p>

## General notes:

- Remaining General Education Requirements as well as elective credits are to be selected in consultation with an advisor to ensure that degree and graduation requirements will be satisfied.
- This transfer guide represents MTA fulfillment. An official transcript that is designated as being "MTA Satisfied" will have satisfied the University Program portion of the General Education Requirements. A portion or all of the Competency Requirements may also be satisfied by an official transcript designating "MTA Satisfied".
- This guide is subject to change and should be used in conjunction with an academic advisor and reflects successful completion of the MTA. All curriculum is governed by the CMU Bulletin based on year of admission. The CMU Bulletin is available online.
- A grade of "C-" or better is required for a course to transfer.
- CMU will accept community college transfer credits beyond the recommended 64 semester hours, however students will need to complete a minimum of 60 semester hours from a baccalaureate institution or equivalent.
- The remaining required and elective courses for the bachelor's degree will be selected in consultation with an academic advisor to ensure that all academic requirements are met.
- The bachelor's degree requires a minimum of 120 semester hours of credit. A minimum of 60 credits must be from a four-year institution.
- A minimum of 40 semester hours of credit at the 300 level or higher is required.
- A minimum of 30 semester hours of credit must be earned from CMU. Writing Intensive and Quantitative Reasoning competencies require a grade of "C" or better to meet the requirement. See your advisor for more information.
