(NCWIT).

MICHAEL INGRAM TO BE INDUCTED INTO NJCAA HALL OF FAME

Michael Ingram, head coach of the LCC Men's Basketball Team, has been selected as an inductee for the **2017 National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Hall of Fame**.

Ingram has served on the LCC's Men's Basketball coaching staff since 1988 and continues to head an impressive 565-224 record. Ingram was the assistant coach in 1988 when the men's team won the **NJCAA National Championship** and has coached his team to four National NJCAA tournament finishes and nineteen Michigan Community College Athletic Association Championships.

The NCWIT focuses on getting girls excited about programming so they will consider IT careers. The JNL grant enabled the program to purchase Ollie SPRK robots for the 24 participants who learned about programming the robot for a final competition.
