DONOR PLEDGES TO MATCH GIFTS TO THE ALLAN MAAR SCHOLARSHIP

A Foundation donor has generously agreed to match dollar-for-dollar any new gifts to a scholarship honoring the memory of LCC Professor Allan Maar. With his passing in 2013, Maar left a legacy of laughter, learning, and support for students. He is remembered for beginning the program - now the Center for Transitional Learning - that assists students needing developmental support, GED preparation, and courses that help students prepare for academic success.

The donor is a former student of Professor Maar who visited the LCC Foundation and told an emotional story of how much Maar meant to his academic and career success.

"Allan Maar was the tipping point of my life. He was the catalyst that sparked my education, the fuel for my flaming desire to learn. Mr. Maar was passionate in his endeavors to teach for success.

I entered Lansing Community College after serving in the military. I was accepted under probation. I had to take one year of basic English, Reading and Math before I could take an accredited course. This was to make up for what I hadn't bothered to learn in high school.

I entered Allan's class with a 6th grade reading level and probably a commensurate vocabulary. Allan gave me the tools and instructions to improve my skills and to succeed in college. He mentored me and became my friend as well as teacher. As a result of his guidance and support, I was able to take an accredited class the next semester.

Within 3 years, I graduated from LCC with an associate degree in electrical engineering and went on to Western Michigan University to complete a degree in engineering. I had a career as a sales engineer, regional sales manager and retired as director of my company's Southwest Region.

I wish that I had kept in touch with Allan during his lifetime to thank him for giving me such an important start in my career.

I have decided to help fund the Allan Maar Memorial Scholarship to endowed status as it will be used to help students who had similar situations as me. This will also help students gain an education who do not have the financial backing that I did through the GI Bill."
