NEURODIAGNOSTIC TECHNOLOGY (NDXT/EEG) APPLICATION

The NDXT program is offered through a partnership with other Michigan Community Colleges as part of the Michigan Radiologic & Imaging Science (MiRIS) Consortium. Students in the program complete NDXT courses delivered in an online environment through [Michigan Colleges Online](https://www.micollegesonline.org/) (<https://www.micollegesonline.org/>).

Once admitted, the program is three semesters long running Fall semester through Summer semester. After completion of the program, students earn an Associate in Applied Science degree. Graduates will be eligible to take the American Board of registration in Electroencephalographic (ABRET) exam. Upon passing the ABRET exam, Neurodiagnostic Technologists have earned their Registered Electroencephalographic Technologist (R.EEG T) certification.

Application Process

Follow these steps to begin the admission process:

1. **APPLY TO LCC:** If you are not currently and have never been an LCC student, [apply to the college](https://lcc.edu/) (<https://lcc.edu/>).
2. ***TRANSFER STUDENTS:** If coming from another college, view our [equivalency lists](https://lcc.edu/academics/transfer/equivalencies/) (<https://lcc.edu/academics/transfer/equivalencies/>) to find how your classes will transfer in. Have your previous institutions send official transcripts directly to LCC Record's Office at the address listed on the equivalency site. **Official transcripts must be received by LCC's Registrars Office no later than May 15th to be considered.** Your transfer school's grading system will be used to convert letter grades to numerical. Grading scales vary by school.
3. **MEET WITH AN ACADEMIC ADVISOR FOR COURSE PLANNING:** [Academic Advisors](http://www.lcc.edu/services/advising/) (www.lcc.edu/services/advising/) are available in the Gannon building Star Zone. To schedule an appointment call (517) 483-1957 *option 4*. Judy Leventhal and Eric Bennett are the lead health advisors.
4. **COMPLETE COURSE ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS:** See next page for a list of admission requirements and the ranking system used to determine admission. A complete program pathway is available on the college's [Degree & Certificate site](https://lcc.edu/academics/catalog/degree-certificate-programs/) (<https://lcc.edu/academics/catalog/degree-certificate-programs/>). **Coursework must be completed by the end of LCC's Spring semester to be considered.** Summer classes are accepted only in the event there are not enough applicants to fill seats.
5. **SUBMIT APPLICATION BY MAY 15th:** Completed applications can be emailed to swansok8@star.lcc.edu **OR** dropped off to the Health & Human Services (HHS) building, room 108. An email verifying your application was received will be sent to your LCC email within 3-5 business days of submission.

Applicants admitted to the program will be required to provide proof of immunizations and Basic Life Support (BLS) certification in accordance with professional standards and clinical-site requirements. Details will be discussed at the Program Orientation that takes place in August. Students must also successfully complete training on OSHA, Bloodborne Pathogens, and HIPAA.

****International students on an F-1 Visa are not eligible for this program since the majority of course content is delivered online.****

Admission Requirements

Seats in the NDXT program are limited. Due to this, admission into this program is on a competitive basis. **Applicants must complete all of the following courses by the end of LCC's Spring semester to be eligible.** Summer classes are accepted only in the event there are not enough applicants to fill seats.

Selection Criteria

All applicants will be ranked using the point system below; those with the highest points will be selected for admission.

1. The following points are awarded based on GPA of admission requirements:

a. 35 points =3.75-4.00 GPA	e. 15 points =2.75-2.99 GPA
b. 30 points =3.50-4.74 GPA	f. 10 points =2.50-2.74 GPA
c. 25 points =3.25-3.49 GPA	g. 5 points =2.00-2.49 GPA
d. 20 points =3.00-3.24 GPA	

2. **2 points** will be awarded for successfully completing each of the following courses on a first attempt. Withdraws are considered an unsuccessful attempt. Only attempts within 5-years are reviewed.
