


Student Success and Quality Education

RISE (Reframing Inclusion through Scholarship and Equity) Institute



The primary goal of the RISE Institute is to improve teaching and therefore enhance success for all students through Critical Pedagogy and Universal Design for Learning. Secondly, the RISE Institute designed to engage staff and administrators of the college in deep-dive conversations, serve as a think-lab and strategy builder for creating an inclusive campus. The focus of this session was to establish what equity is in order to conduct equity work and the importance of identifying students that need services when they feel invincible.




Courageous Conversations


On December 10, the Office of Diversity and Inclusion and fellows from the RISE (Reframing Inclusion through Scholarship and Equity) Institute facilitated the third courageous conversation of the series. Dr. Tonya Bailey facilitated the discussion and this conversation featured a Q&A session with City of Lansing Police Chief Daryl Green, and LCC's Sergeant Timothy Davis, Lieutenant Rodney Bahl, Tamara McDiarmid, and James Campbell. Topics for this online

conversation included: Race Relations, Law Enforcement, and Community Conversations. There were approximately 160 employees, students, and community members in attendance. These courageous conversations are in response to the violence and systemic inequities faced by the African American community in the US. The purpose of the discussions is to create a space of inclusion to let every member of our community know they are valued, they belong here, and that we celebrate the rich diversity they bring to LCC.





Men About Progress (MAP) Program



On December 7, Men About Progress (MAP) members discussed how they were doing, what they were thankful for and what were their biggest challenges this semester, year, month or all. This session allowed for all participants to open up and be vulnerable with each other and allowed for each member to know that they had someone in their corner. The MAP group continued to plan



Key topics included stress management, LCC resources available to students, and inviting someone from the Kinesiology department to talk about and demonstrate appropriate exercise. The group also talked about what they wanted to do better in their lives in the new year. The MAP initiative established by the Office of Diversity and Inclusion at LCC is intended to increase, encourage, and support the inclusion and educational success of male students of color, particularly African-Americans. MAP meetings are held every other Monday at 5pm.

Women Inspiring Scholarship through Empowerment (WISE)

On December 2, Dr. Tonya Bailey, Chief Diversity Officer, held the second information session for the Women Inspiring Scholarship through Empowerment (WISE) initiative to recruit students and mentors. The WISE initiative is dedicated to the education and support of the professional career interests of women students at Lansing Community College. It seeks to inspire, support

and empower women by offering educational opportunities for development of knowledge and leadership skills, building of professional and personal connections, promoting the presence of professional women, and fostering mentoring relationships. The WISE initiative is set to begin in spring 2021.





Beyond the Book Circle Discussions





With the guidance of the Office of Diversity and Inclusion, the Beyond the Book initiative is to expand the dialogues, learning, and engagement around diversity, equity, and inclusion themed books to foster a greater sense of community all while celebrating difference. This year four books were selected for each of the following themes: Accountability & Advocacy, Diversity & Racial Equity, Gender & Self-Identity, and Global & Cultural Perspectives. In February there will be more opportunities to participate in the circle discussions for these books.



Academic and Workforce Development Excellence

Continuing Education Department Updates

The Continuing Education department has been busy during Fall 2020. 161 non-credit students were taught in a face-to-face format using approved Safety Plans, and 69 students took online classes. Additionally, seven new D2L Brightspaces classes were developed by adjunct faculty and are ready for students to enroll in.

The Business & Community Institute Pushes Hard to Help Companies with Going Pro Talent Fund (GPTF)

During 2 short months the BCI team worked directly with 168 companies to develop training plans for GPTF applications, and developed training proposals valued at \$2.9 million for companies to include on their applications. It is estimated that approximately \$1.5 million in training will actually be submitted in applications.

BCI Delivers Training to Michigan Credit Union League and Affiliates (MCULA)

Through their new online training platform, D2L Brightspace for Corporate Learning platform, BCI was pleased to train a new client, the Michigan Credit Union League and Affiliates. In order to help support its members, the MCULA offered eight hours of training to its leaders. The training kicked off with DiSC, helping folks to understand their own behavior styles and then applying that knowledge in the workplace. The second topic was timely—HR Fundamentals: Managing Crisis and Conflict Resiliency. This high-output session covered COVID-19, along with the types of crises organizations face and how to address them from a human resources perspective. Participants obtained practical applications for using the six most generally accepted attributes of individual and group resiliency. In addition, this training offered employees and managers strategies for facing unforeseen challenges and reigniting teams after experiencing setbacks.

Health & Human Services (HHS) Division and Business & Community Institute (BCI) partner to complete 3rd cohort of MA Apprenticeship Program

On November 9, Lansing Community College's Medical Assistant (MA) Apprenticeship program graduated 16 students, all employees of Sparrow Health Systems. Covid-19 brought unique challenges to this year's program, with students experiencing front-line medical care in a pandemic, and forcing classroom training to be virtual for a time. The MA Apprenticeship program consists of 736 hours over 31 weeks delivered through the HHS. That includes 208 hours of lecture and 368 lab hours. Apprentices also completed 160 hours of practicum at the employer's site. The program is consistent with the appropriate industry review boards, and covered 239 core competencies. This was LCC's third MA apprenticeship program in health care, and joins the mix of registered apprenticeship programs coordinated with the U.S. Department of Labor. The program was administered through LCC's Business & Community Institute and Health and Human Services (HHS) Division.









Small Business Development Center (SBDC) Metrics

SBDC activity and impact metrics for January 1 through December 31, 2020:

Consulted with 593 business owners or individuals hoping to start, grow or rescue a business, delivering a total of 4,142 consulting hours.

Helped those clients secure \$14,021,317 of new capital, to launch or grow their businesses.

Senior Consultant Delivers Applying for PPP Loan Forgiveness Webinar

On December 8, new Senior Consultant Dale Horton delivered a webinar entitled "Applying for PPP Loan Forgiveness." Eighty-five participants, both locally and from around the state, participated in this online event.



Extension Centers – East Updates

Two PT Support will be helping the Registrar's office log incoming transcripts and degree applications.

The LCC East Coordinator presented a proposal to the Strategic Enrollment Management team for an evening cohort business program to be held at LCC East, starting fall, 2021. The proposal was well received by the team and the non-traditional student sub-committee will discuss how to implement the plan.

The LCC East Coordinator was interviewed by a graduate intern from Sinclair College in Dayton Ohio for information on challenges and tips for running a branch campus.

Extension center support staff participated in a calling campaign on behalf of Technical Careers to reach students before the December 15 drop deadline who had registered for classes, but who had not set up a payment plan.

Extension center support staff participated in a calling campaign on behalf of Technical Careers to reach students who were in a Technical Careers class or major during fall 2020, but who had not yet registered for a spring 2021 class. Staff called 900 students by the close of business on December 22.

Livingston County Center Staff Serve Early College Nursing Students

The Livingston County Center Coordinator and Support Staff, along with the Livingston Educational Service Agency Early College Coordinator, safely served 41 Early College nursing students on December 15. Students picked up spring textbooks and dropped off fall textbooks in front of the Parker building. Students were happy for the short visit and are looking forward to spring semester.



Community Impact and Engagement

Nursing Program Direct Patient Care Workers Receiving COVID Vaccinations

The Ingham County Health Department has offered COVID vaccinations to all healthcare students and faculty providing direct patient care. The nursing program has implemented into ACEMAPP the COVID vaccination capability for students and faculty to upload their documentation, and is seeing a positive response with immunization rates among LCC students and clinical faculty at this time.


Futures for Frontliners and Technical Careers Highlighted on Morning Blend

Fire Academy Recruits Complete Training Successfully


All of the 71st Fire Academy recruits completed training with 4.0's and passed the State of Michigan testing. Congratulations to all!




Marketing promoted the Spring performing arts event in the Star and created a graphic for the Facebook event.




Marketing Creates Conference Room Diagrams






Marketing Creates COVID Signage






Marketing Creates Postcard and Coordinates 2020 Year-End Popular Financial Services Report
