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The effects of unresolved or under-resolved post-traumatic stress are increasingly recognized as contributing to the co-occurrence of mental/emotional and substance use disorders which accumulate over the course of a lifetime. For older adults, additional risk factors can further complicate effective treatment, including increased grief & loss, isolation, and age-related challenges to cognitive functioning. This session will address the likelihood of the occurrence of post-traumatic stress in older adults, how trauma-informed principles are important to apply in the provision of behavioral health care services, and will describe three evidence-based trauma-resolution treatment approaches.
