Ethical decision making takes practice. Interprofessional ethical decision-making requires an understanding of ethics from the perspectives of various disciplines. This interactive workshop will review the comprehensive ETHIC model in the context of working with other professionals with varying experience and guiding principles. The presenter will use case examples to facilitate discussion of ethical challenges that may arise, including working with individuals with cognitive impairment, through telemedicine, and at the end of life. Participants are encouraged to bring examples of difficult decisions encountered in their work to discuss in small groups.
