Michigan is no exception in the nation's opioid epidemic, and misuse among older adults is becoming an increasing public health concern. This training will look at the biology of addiction, how opioids affect brain function, common opioids by class (prescription and non-prescription), signs and symptoms of misuse, over dose symptoms and risks, as well as treatments. The presenter will discuss new guidelines for opioid use for pain, the benefits, and alternatives to reduce the risk of addiction in older adults.

Note: Community Mental Health staff responsible for PASRR evaluations are eligible for reimbursement (to their agency) for the costs of attending this workshop, using the regular PASRR billing process through the MDHHS QMP, OBRA Section.


